Objectives: To develop the knowledge base necessary to select and utilize pedagogical materials for performance-based curriculum in Chinese/Japanese.

General description. You will explore the means for pedagogical presentation of Chinese/Japanese at various levels of instruction. Consideration will be given to material selection and use, pacing, and presentation practice of language in culture. Adaptation of materials for performance-based curriculum will be discussed.

- Homework and quizzes (approximately 50%)
